It is that time of year again when yard sales and moving sales become popular - and some people begin to use utility poles as public bulletin boards. Hudson Light has a long-standing policy of prohibiting the posting of signs on our utility poles.



Every year we receive complaints from residents about unsightly signs posted on utility poles. The poles are for utilities - the electric, phone and cable services that are so important to your everyday lives. The poles need to be kept clear of signs, nails and tacks that could tear utility employees' protective clothing and place him or her in danger. We are sure you do not want our line workers injured when they are trying to climb a utility pole to restore or maintain your service.

Signs can block the pole identification number that a customer may use to report a problem or pole damage. They can also obstruct a motorist's line of vision at intersections, etc.

So remember, not only do they clutter up the neighborhood, but signs on utility poles could also interfere with important utility work.
